2. Digital publics, the Academic Twitter model



Academia & social media are both reputational economies




Hashtags + Public voice + Positional identities = Fraught public sphere

"The rot we're seeing in Twitter is the rot of participatory media devolved into competitive spheres where the collective "we" treats conversational contributions as fixed print-like identity claims."

The sense of participatory collective—always fraught—has waned as more and more subcultures are crammed and collapsed into a common, traceable, searchable medium. We hang over each other's heads, more and more heavily, self-appointed swords of Damocles

The social network fundamentally changed in early 2014. And that's causing big problems for the company.


